ABOUT

Therapeutic play is a specific approach to engage children, because it is a developmentally sensitive way to communicate and facilitate expression of the child's thoughts and feelings, and may be applied to medical and health care settings and experiences. Therapeutic medical play may also be used proactively to prepare children before and to debrief after medical encounters, and using specific approaches during procedural phases.

This two day workshop integrates knowledge of paediatric medical and health care, childhood development and therapeutic play. It has been developed to extend the clinical skills of health care professionals who work with children and their families in health care settings. Following this experiential workshop participants should be able to:

1. Prioritise children as health care consumers
2. Identify the four main categories of therapeutic powers of play
3. Sequence and discuss when, what and why procedural play strategies are used for children requiring medical or health care interventions, including
 - a. Pre-procedural play
 - b. Procedural distraction
 - c. Medical play therapy
4. Practise therapeutic play skills
 - a. Attunement
 - b. Tracking
 - c. Empathic reflections
 - d. Congruence
 - e. Structuring sessions
 - f. Therapeutic limit setting
5. Identify and consider suitable play spaces for children to engage in medical play
6. Review types of toys, tools and media suitable for medical play therapy, including puppet play.

Dr Judi Parson is a paediatric qualified Registered Nurse, Play Therapist / Supervisor, Lecturer in Mental Health and Course Director for the Graduate Certificate / Diploma of Therapeutic Child Play and Master of Child Play Therapy courses at Deakin University.
